

NET CONTROL SCRIPT

Cascade Amateur Radio Enthusiasts

Updated 5-18-26 KO

Pre-net (5–10 minutes before 7:00 pm):

This is [your call sign], [your name] in [your location]. The Cascade Amateur Radio Enthusiasts Repeater Net will begin at 7:00 pm local time. All stations please stand by.

Good evening. This is [your call sign], [your name] in [your location]. I will be your Net Control for the Cascade Amateur Radio Enthusiasts Repeater Net, also known as the C.A.R.E. Net.

This net meets every Monday evening at 7:00 p.m. local time on the 145.410 MHz repeater (negative offset, 100 Hz tone). Immediately following this net, we invite everyone to join the Simplex Net on 147.585 MHz. Please join us so we can keep our simplex capabilities ready.

Information about the Cascade Amateur Radio Enthusiasts can be found at www.carehamradio.com. Please check the club website often for news, updates, and meeting minutes.

This is a directed net — please direct all communications through Net Control. Anyone with emergency or priority traffic may break in at any time.

Are there any stations with emergency or priority traffic?

Hearing none, we'll proceed.

Are there any announcements?

The purpose of this net is to check equipment operation and provide training for emergency communications — both as a participant and as Net Control. We encourage everyone to stay for the entire net unless you need an early out.

Are there any members who need an early out this evening?

Regular C.A.R.E. members will be called first from the roster. New visitors and guests are welcome to check in after the member roll call. When checking in, please clearly state your call sign, your name, and your location.

SIMPLEX NET

This net meets every Monday evening immediately following the 7:00 p.m. repeater session on the simplex frequency of 147.585 MHz. We invite both members and guests to join us so we can keep our simplex operating skills sharp and our equipment tested.

This is a directed net — please direct all communications through Net Control. Anyone with emergency or priority traffic may break in at any time.

Before we begin, are there any stations with emergency or priority traffic?

Hearing none, we'll proceed.

The purpose of this net is to check equipment operation and provide training for emergency communications, both as a participant and as Net Control.

Important note for this simplex net: If I call a station and do not hear them, please break in with the word "RELAY" and let me know you can hear them so we can get everyone into the log.

C.A.R.E. members who checked in on the repeater will be called first. New visitors and guests are welcome to check in after the member roll call. When checking in, please clearly state your call sign, name, and location.
